



FRENCH BRIDGING PROGRAM

LFKL offers French language support for non-French speaking students from year 1 to year 3, to ensure that no students are left alone in the process of learning and development when following our French curriculum. These additional French classes enable students to optimize their command of the French language. Students will participate to an "integration class" for 1.5 hour per day (equivalent to 7.5 hours per week) during school hours, in a group consisting of maximum 12 pupils. Students also take part in "French as a Foreign Language" lessons during their Extra Curricular Activity (ECA) for an additional 4 hours per week.

Moreover, Students will be participating with their classmates in learning about the "linguistic pathway" in French (1 hour per week) in order to improve the command of oral and written French (8 to 10 hours per week).



During Middle School, various subjects are taught to students, these include: French, Mathematics, History and Geography, Civic Education, Life and Earth Sciences, Technology, Art, Musical Education, Physical Education, Physics and Chemistry, two Modem languages as well as the History of Art.

Students will also be taking part in Cross- Curricular Studies, where they learn how to work on different news-related subjects, to present and create useful informative tools using IT programs. This helps the teachers to evaluate their skills and assignments when they work in groups.

At the end of Year 10, students will sit for their first final examination - the "Diplome National du Brevet (DNB)."

EUROPEAN CLASS

The European Class (Section Européenne - SE) is offered to High School students, from 2nde to Terminale, and helps them develop their skills in foreign languages as well as their cultural knowledge of foreign countries.

At LFKL, this optional class includes 2 additional hours of teaching per week, consisting of 1 hour in History and Geography and 1 hour in English. During the English hour, the focus is on getting the students to practice and improve on their speaking and listening skills, through the methods such as debating (MUN), radio broadcasting, presentations, etc.

A NEW FRENCH BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM

Former sections "Science", "Litterature" and "Economical Science" are being replaced by new "Speciality courses", allowing students to choose new subjects (such as Arts; History-Geography, Geopolitics and Political Science; Human Sciences, Literature and Philosophy; Digital Technology and Computer Science; Foreign Languages, Literatures and Civilisations (English); Mathematics; Physics-Chemistry; Earth and Life Sciences; Economic and Social Sciences) to customize their curriculum.



LANGUAGE CLASSES

LFKL offers an early English Language program design to integrate non-French speaking students starting from the kindergarten stage. The teaching of the English language is divided to reach a weekly amount of 7 hours, from Nursery (PS) to Year 6 (CM2), depending on each student's language profile and their mastery of the French language as it remains the main language at school.

Students work in small groups of up to 12 to 13 and participate in educational activities in English. At the end of the school year, all CM2 students will sit for internationally-recognized English language exam certified by Cambridge. Thus, each student will obtain a certificate, from A1 to B1, upon finishing Primary School.

In Middle School - in addition to English - students will have the opportunity to learn 4 additional languages (German, Spanish, Mandarin, and Bahasa Melayu) and receive international certifications every year (Cambridge, DELF, DELE, IELTS, and HSK). Hence, most of our students will become bilingual or trilingual by the end of their studies at LFKL.












The LFKL is known for its outstanding results at the French National Examinations, with a 100% success rate at the Baccalaureate, and having 83% of our students graduating with Honors during the 2019 examination session.

LEADING TO A DIVERSIFIED HIGHER EDUCATION OFFER France offers high quality education at affordable costs

in co-mparison to other countries. With more than 1,200 classes provided in English, along with its strategic geographical location and strong positioning in Europe, France has attracted 2.5 million students, 12% from abroad.

France has more than 3,500 public and private higher educational institutions: 72 universities, 25 multi-institute campuses, 271 Doctoral schools, 227 engineering schools (which are all authorized to award the title of Engineer), 220 business and management schools, 45 post-secondary public schools of art, 22 schools of architecture and 3,000 private schools and institutes.

The French Higher Education adopts the Licence-Master-Doctorat (Bachelor's-Master's-Doctorate) system, also known as the LMD system. The three-level organization of post-secondary education is shared by most countries in the European Union (EU). This system standardizes the qualification levels and streamlines recognition of the degrees obtained in different countries across the EU.

International students will surely benefit from highly diversified trainings, as they are enrolled in every field, at every level. Students will be following the French Higher Education system, which is divided into Public Universities, Grandes Écoles (specializing in Business or Engineering) and Specialized Schools in the subjects of Art, Architecture, etc.

PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES

France's 83 public universities are funded by the national government, which closely regulates the "national diplomas" granted by the universities. This system allows the universities to offer students an excellent education in all disciplines at a very affordable price.

Some of France's 3,000 high schools provide courses in preparation for entry to the Grandes Écoles, the Classes Préparatoires Grandes Écoles (CPGE), others have two-year technical programs, called Sections de Techniciens Supérieurs (STS), or classes in preparation for the national Brevet de Technicien Supérieur (BTS).

The Grandes Écoles are very selective and students will Get in touch with us to find out which lycées, universities have to pass the rigorous written and oral exams to be and Grandes Écoles have their doors opened. eligible for enrolment. The traditional Grande Écoles select candidates among those who have completed two years of dedicated preparatory classes after graduating from high school.

Students will then study for 5 years (3 years BBA + 2 years MSc in management) and receive the prestigious national diploma. Many Grandes Écoles also offer shorter master programs, such as MBA, MIB (Master of International Business), MIM (Master of International Management), Mastère Spécialisé, etc.

Degree programs in the Grandes Écoles usually include international internships and studying abroad. Teaching in English are quite common and having programs with strong links to the industry are also some of the advantages of the Grandes Écoles.








BOURSES EXCELLENCE MAJOR

The French government, via the AEFE and MAEDI (Foreign Affairs and International Development Ministry), supports student mobility by granting Excellence-Major scholarships.





This Excellence-Major grant scheme enables France to support around 800 students from diverse foreign nationalities during their five years of studies - in reference to the time needed for a student to obtain a Master Degree or equivalent. Each year, between 150 to 200 new students will be awarded with this grant.















EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (ECA)

The ECA team offers cultural, sports and artistic activities for students from preschool to highschool.

The main objective of these activities is to provide students with a refreshing introduction to a total of 24 different artistic and sports activities, to encourage and stimulate their mental and physical growth and well-beings.

At LFKL, we have a team of 22 skilled instructors to conduct and supervise our students during their ECA activities. Students can participate to ECA's up to 3 times a week following the schedule below:

LFKL provides high-quality food to boost our students' bodies and minds, and we encourage our students to practice healthy eating habits in a welcoming environment.



Our catering service — Delischool - validates its daily menus with a dietician and encourages students at the LFKL to balance their meals and consume the five essential elements consisting of vegetables, grains and breads, proteins (meat, fish, eggs, etc.), fruits, dairy products, as well as water.

Students from the Kindergarten and CP have a dedicated canteen and are served at the table.

For those in the Elementary, Middle and High Schools, students will collect their foods via self-service, and we will provide students with two balanced meals every day consisting of an Asian dish set and a Western dish set.







TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

LFKL offers bus services to transport our students from home to school in the morning, and from school to home in the afternoon. Our school buses are fitted with safety belts. It is compulsory for every student using the bus service to wear their safety belt and keep it attached for the whole journey.

All buses are equipped with video surveillance (CCTV) whose records are kept 48 hours. In the afternoon, the school offers 4 respective departure times from school, at 2.45pm, 4.30pm, 5.30pm and 6.30pm.

The bus service covers 15 different neighborhoods the bus service covers 15 different neighborhoods (Ampang, KLCC, Desa Park City, PJ, TTDI, Mont Kiara, Sri Hartamas, Bukit Tunku, Bukit Damansara, Bangsar). There will also be a one-off RM275 first-time enrolment fee, and RM110 administrative fee to be paid annually.
