

The French School of Kuala Lumpur (LFKL) first opened in 1962. It now gathers 720 students from 38 different countries, from kindergarten to high-school.

The establishment offers a multicultural education provided by **qualified French** teachers attached to the Ministry of National Education and by professional English nativespeaking teachers.

Every year, the LFKL welcomes national education inspectors.

Open to plurilingualism, the LFKL takes into account the diversity of its students and offers a curriculum adapted throughout their schooling. Foreign languages are taught from the kindergarten stage through educational activities by group level.

The LFKL enables students to access the best international universities and top higher institutions.

The school is known for its outstanding results at the French national examinations (100% success rate at the Baccalaureate, with 90% of Graduation with honours at the 2018 session). LFKL students follow a French curriculum and benefit from a high standard education that includes cultural, artistic, technical, scientific, literary and sports activities.

The LFKL is part of the AEFE, a global network of 500 French schools in 137 countries. French schools abroad share a unique curriculum, allowing students to pursue their studies anywhere around the world. The AEFE also offers scholarships to foreign bachelors who wish to pursue their studies in France.

In secondary school, students have the opportunity to learn several languages: English, German, Spanish, Malay, Chinese and Latin. They pass language exams every year and receive international language certifications (Cambridge Exam, DELF, DELE, IELTS).

Last year,

55% of the graduates left the LFKL to study in France, 45% of them decided to continue their studies abroad (in Canada, England, Australia, Switzerland, Spain, the United States, Malaysia and in Indonesia) in prestigious institutions and universities.



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Every year, the LFKL participates to the PROZAP (Asia Pacific Zone Projects). It has been almost 15 years that ten LFKL students participate to the **MYMUN and SIMUN conferences** that gather international schools from different asian countries.

Students are invited to debate in English on various topics such as politics, economics, social and environmental issues.



Our Grade 6 and 7 students also participate in the interclass junior competition of "Mathematics Without Borders", a test of 9 scientific exercises, one of which must be solved in a foreign language.

This competition is a great challenge for students, demonstrating their teamwork, initiative, motivation and research.

Primary and secondary school students are invited to work, exchange together, and practice the use of a foreign language in mathematics.

The LFKL encourages the venue of French artists, this year the school received the visit of Hersk and Jeremi CA.

In December, the LFKL will once again launch the **Azimut and Segalen literary prizes**. A selection of young novels will be offered to our elementary and high school students.

As part of the project, the school will be welcoming **Cédric Janvier**, one of the authors of our 2019 book selection.



In 2016, the LFKL organized the 4th Asian Pacific Swimming Championship (CAPN). During 4 days of competition, the establishment welcomed 10 teams and 300 swimmers gathered for the event, coming from Shanghai, Phnom Penh, Bangkok, Hong-Kong, Vientiane, Singapore, Jakarta, Pattaya and Sydney.

This year, the LFKL will participate to the 8th CAPN edition that will take place in Singapore.

High school students will also be attending the Badminton Championship from the 28th November to the 1st December 2018 in Jakarta, the Dubai Golf Games for a multi-sport competition and the 3rd Rugby Clover tournament in Tokyo in September 2019.
